#### "Born out of Wenlock, the London 2012 Olympic Connection."



The Cheese & Wine evening organised by Llanfechain Show committee in mid-May is now a well established part of the calendar and over the years there have been many interesting speakers. None more so than this year's speaker, Chris Cannon, the archivist of the Wenlock Olympian Society. The first Olympian Games in Much Wenlock were held in 1850 started by Dr. William Penny Brookes. The Games were made up of physical activities and also artistic competitions so had parallels with our own Show which contains not only sports for the children but also horticulture and arts & craft competitions. These Games in the smallShropshire town of Much Wenlock were the catalyst for the founding of the Modern Olympic Games, the first being held in Athens in 1896. The unveiling of the mascot called Wenlock for the London 2012 Games ensured that the unique his tory and traditions of the Wenlock Olympic Games were recognised throughout the world. Chris spoke of the international media interest in Much Wenlock and the community's pride in their heritage. He also told of his many trips around the world giving presentations and taking out artefacts for exhibitions. He ended his presentation by passing around the Olympic Torch which had been carried through Much Wenlock twice and had then been donated to the Society. The evening was rounded off with a glass of wine and a wonderful supper provided by the committee.
